Sunday, March 2, Fourth Sunday in Lent

we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, March 9, Fifth Sunday in Lent

Ez 37:12-14/Rom 8:8-11/Jn 11:1-45 or 11:3-7, 17, 20-27, 33b-45

For all former caregivers mourning the death of their care-receivers: May they find comfort knowing that Christ has called their loved one to eternal life,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, March 16, Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Mt 21:1-11 (37)/ Is 50:4-7/Phil 2:6-11/Mt 26:14—27:66 or 27:11-54

That during this Holy Week caregivers will realize that even though they may not be able to attend services at their church, they are offering a tremendous service to a beloved son or daughter of God every day,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, March 23, Easter Sunday: The Resurrection of the Lord

Acts 10:34a, 37-43/Col 3:1-4 or 1 Cor 5:6b-8/Jn 20:1-9 (42) or Mt 28:1-10 (41)

or, at an afternoon or evening Mass, Lk 24:13-35

In thanksgiving for the family caregivers in our parish: May the Risen Lord richly bless them and their loved ones today and always,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, March 30, Second Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy Sunday

Acts 2:42-47/1 Pt 1:3-9/Jn 20:19-31

we pray to the Lord.
