Sunday, December 3, First Sunday of Advent

Is 63:16b-17, 19b; 64:2-7/1 Cor 1:3-9/Mk 13:33-37

That the light of Christ will shine in the hearts and homes of all caregivers and care-receivers,
we pray to the Lord.

Friday, December 8, The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Gn 3:9-15, 20/Eph 1:3-6, 11-12/Lk 1:26-38

For family caregivers who, like Mary, have answered “yes” to God’s invitation to serve,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, December 10, Second Sunday of Advent

Is 40:1-5, 9-11/2 Pt 3:8-14/Mk 1:1-8

In thanksgiving for the caregivers in our parish who give comfort to their loved ones,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, December 17, Third Sunday of Advent

Is 61:1-2a, 10-11/1 Thes 5:16-24/Jn 1:6-8, 19-28

For those caring for a loved one who is brokenhearted because of the many changes and challenges in his or her life,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, December 24

7Fourth Sunday of Advent

2 Sm 7:1-5, 8b-12, 14a, 16/Rom 16:25-27/Lk 1:26-38

That caregivers, though at times their hearts are troubled and they are afraid, will know the presence of God as they go about their many caregiving duties,
we pray to the Lord.

Monday, December 25, Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord

Vigil: Is 62:1-5/Acts 13:16-17, 22-25/Mt 1:1-25 or 1:18-25

Night: Is 9:1-6/Ti 2:11-14/Lk 2:1-14 (14)

Dawn: Is 62:11-12/Ti 3:4-7/Lk 2:15-20 (15)

Day: Is 52:7-10/Heb 1:1-6/Jn 1:1-18 or 1:1-5, 9-14

That caregivers and care-receivers may be richly blessed on this feast of love incarnate,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, December 31, The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

Sir 3:2-6, 12-14/Col 3:12-21 or 3:12-17/Mt 2:13-15, 19-23

For all families facing the challenges of caring for a loved one who is sick, elderly, disabled or frail,
we pray to the Lord.

Monday, January 1, The Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God

Nm 6:22-27/Gal 4:4-7/Lk 2:16-21

That God will bless and keep all family caregivers, look upon them kindly and give them peace,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, January 7, The Epiphany of the Lord

Is 60:1-6/Eph 3:2-3a, 5-6/Mt 2:1-12

For those who, day after day, give the gifts of compassion and concern by their respectfully caring for a loved one,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, January 14, Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 Sm 3:3b-10, 19/1 Cor 6:13c-15a, 17-20/Jn 1:35-42

For those who have responded “Here I am, Lord” to God’s call to care for a spouse, aging parent, child or sibling with special needs, family member or friend,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, January 21, Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jon 3:1-5, 10/1 Cor 7:29-31/Mk 1:14-20

For caregivers who have left their jobs and their homes to return home to take care of an aging father or mother,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, January 28, Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dt 18:15-20/1 Cor 7:32-35/Mk 1:21-28

That, as a parish and as individuals, we will never hesitate to help ease the anxieties and concerns of caregivers assisting a loved one,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, February 4, Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jb 7:1-4, 6-7/1 Cor 9:16-19, 22-23/Mk 1:29-39

That during this week that includes the World Day of the Sick on February 11th, those who are ill and their caregivers will feel the comforting presence of God when they need it most,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, February 11, Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Lv 13:1-2, 44-46/1 Cor 10:31—11:1/Mk 1:40-45

That family caregivers know they can turn to the Lord in times of trouble and that He will give them peace of mind and heart,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, February 18, First Sunday of Lent

Gn 9:8-15/1 Pt 3:18-22/Mk 1:12-15

That throughout this season of Lent all parishioners will pray for those who are taking care of a loved one who is sick, elderly, disabled or frail,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, February 25, Second Sunday of Lent

Gn 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18/Rom 8:31b-34/Mk 9:2-10

For family caregivers who, at times, can feel that they are being put to the test,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, March 3, Third Sunday of Lent

Ex 20:1-17 or 20:1-3, 7-8, 12-17/1 Cor 1:22-25/Jn 2:13-25 (29), or, for Year A,
Ex 17:3-7/Rom 5:1-2, 5-8/Jn 4:5-42 or 4:5-15, 19b-26, 39a, 40-42

For all those honoring their father or mother by taking care of an aging parent,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, March 10, Fourth Sunday of Lent

2 Chr 36:14-16, 19-23/Eph 2:4-10/Jn 3:14-21 (32) or, for Year A, 1 Sm 16:1b, 6-7, 10-13a/Eph 5:8-14/Jn 9:1-41 or 9:1, 6-9, 13-17, 34-38

That the beginning of spring may be a time of renewal and hope for all family caregivers,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, March 17, Fifth Sunday of Lent

Jer 31:31-34/Heb 5:7-9/Jn 12:20-33 (35) or, for Year A, Ez 37:12-14/Rom 8:8-11/
Jn 11:1-45 or 11:3-7, 17, 20-27, 33b-45

That family caregivers will be given the grace to see that in serving their loved ones they are serving Christ,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, March 24, Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Mk 11:1-10 or Jn 12:12-16/Is 50:4-7/Phil 2:6-11/Mk 14:1—15:47 or 15:1-39

That family caregivers, sometimes weary from so many responsibilities, will know that this community is praying for them,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, March 31, Easter Sunday

Acts 10:34a, 37-43/Col 3:1-4 or 1 Cor 5:6b-8/Jn 20:1-9 or Mk 16:1-7 or, at an afternoon or evening Mass, Lk 24:13-35

That all caregivers grieving because of the recent death of their loved will find peace and hope in Christ's Resurrection,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, April 7, Second Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy Sunday

Acts 4:32-35/1 Jn 5:1-6/Jn 20:19-31

That families caring for a loved one may, with one heart and one mind, put aside past differences and come together in love and service,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, April 14, Third Sunday of Easter

Acts 3:13-15, 17-19/1 Jn 2:1-5a/Lk 24:35-48

That the Author of Life will give peace and strength to family caregivers who are helping a loved one who is nearing the end of his or her life,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, April 21, Fourth Sunday of Easter

Acts 4:8-12/1 Jn 3:1-2/Jn 10:11-18

In thanksgiving for all those, especially family caregivers, who perform countless good deeds to help those who have physical, mental or emotional illnesses,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, April 28, Fifth Sunday of Easter

Acts 9:26-31/1 Jn 3:18-24/Jn 15:1-8

For family caregivers who love not simply in word or speech but in deed and truth,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, May 5, Sixth Sunday of Easter

Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48/1 Jn 4:7-10/Jn 15:9-17

For family caregivers who, in so many ways, lay down their lives for their care-receivers,
we pray to the Lord.

Thursday May 9 or Sunday, May 12, Ascension of the Lord

Acts 1:1-11/ Eph 1:17-23 or 4:1-13 or 4:1-7, 11-13/Mk 16:15-20

For former family caregivers grieving the death of a loved one who has been taken from them into heaven,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, May 19, Pentecost Sunday

Vigil: Gn 11:1-9 or Ex 19:3-8a, 16-20b or Ez 37:1-14 or Jl 3:1-5/Rom 8:22-27/

Jn 7:37-39

Day: Acts 2:1-11/1 Cor 12:3b-7, 12-13 or Gal 5:16-25/Jn 20:19-23 or Jn 15:26-27;

16:12-15

That the Holy Spirit will fill the hearts and homes of all family caregivers and their care-receivers,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, May 26, The Most Holy Trinity

Dt 4:32-34, 39-40/Rom 8:14-17/Mt 28:16-20

For those who, being led by the Spirit, have accepted the vocation of family caregiver and are assisting a loved one who is sick, elderly, disabled or frail,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, June 2, The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Ex 24:3-8/Heb 9:11-15/Mk 14:12-16, 22-26

For priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist who bring the Body of Christ to care-receivers and caregivers in homes, hospitals and nursing homes,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, June 9, Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Gn 3:9-15/2 Cor 4:13—5:1/Mk 3:20-35 (89) Pss II

That family caregivers in our parish will know that — doing God's will by caring for their loved one — they are Jesus's "brother and sister and mother."
We pray to the Lord.

Sunday, June 16, Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Ez 17:22-24/2 Cor 5:6-10/Mk 4:26-34

For family caregivers who, at times, God asks to courageously walk by faith, not by sight,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, June 23, Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jb 38:1, 8-11/2 Cor 5:14-17/Mk 4:35-41

For family caregivers who face and have to deal with so many fears, that they may know the peace of Christ, who is with them always,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, June 30, Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Wis 1:13-15; 2:23-24/2 Cor 8:7, 9, 13-15/Mk 5:21-43 or 5:21-24, 35b-43

For those helping a loved one who has a serious medical issue or chronic condition, or is in the final months or weeks of life,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, July 7, Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Ez 2:2-5/2 Cor 12:7-10/Mk 6:1-6a

For those who, hearing the Lord speak to them and ask them to help, have accepted the vocation of caring for a loved one who is sick, elderly, disabled or frail,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, July 14, Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Am 7:12-15/Eph 1:3-14 or 1:3-10/Mk 6:7-13

For the long-distance caregivers in our parish who – like the apostles sent by Jesus – are helping a loved one living in a different city, state or region,

we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, July 21, Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jer 23:1-6/Eph 2:13-18/Mk 6:30-34

That as fellow parishioners, family members and friends, we will readily step forward so that the family caregivers among us have opportunities to “come away . . . and rest awhile,”
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, July 28, Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

2 Kgs 4:42-44/Eph 4:1-6/Jn 6:1-15

For family caregivers who so often feel overwhelmed: May they know that Jesus is with them and continues to bless and multiply their efforts just as he blessed and multiplied the five small loaves and two little fish,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, August 4, Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Ex 16:2-4, 12-15/Eph 4:17, 20-24/Jn 6:24-35

That just as God gave the Israelites manna in the desert, day by day, he will give family caregivers the strength, patience and perseverance they need to continue helping their loved ones,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, August 11, Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 Kgs 19:4-8/Eph 4:30—5:2/Jn 6:41-51

That kindness and compassion may be the hallmarks of the relationship between caregivers and those in their care; and, if their relationship has been strained in the past, that a spirit of forgiveness will bring reconciliation,
we pray to the Lord.

Thursday, August 15, The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Vigil: 1 Chr 15:3-4, 15-16; 16:1-2/1 Cor 15:54b-57/Lk 11:27-28

Day: Rv 11:19a; 12:1-6a, 10ab/1 Cor 15:20-27/Lk 1:39-56

That family caregivers and those in their care find comfort in knowing the time will come when they will be together in heaven for all eternity,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, August 18, Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Prv 9:1-6/Eph 5:15-20/Jn 6:51-58 (119) Pss IV

For family caregivers who are struggling “to try to understand what is the will of the Lord.” May they find peace and “be filled with the Spirit,
We pray to the Lord.

Sunday, August 25, Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jos 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b/Eph 5:21-32 or 5:2a, 25-32/Jn 6:60-69

For all those who are taking care of their husband or their wife,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, September 1, Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dt 4:1-2, 6-8/Jas 1:17-18, 21b-22, 27/Mk 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

For all parents taking care of a son or daughter with special needs; and for sons and daughters taking care of an aging parent,

we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, September 8, Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Isaiah 35:4-7a/James 2:1-5/Mark 7:31-37

For family caregivers whose hearts are frightened: May they find strength and courage, knowing the Lord is with them,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, September 15, Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Isaiah 50:5-9a/James 2:14-18/Mark 8:27-35

In thanksgiving for family caregivers who, day after day, demonstrate their faith by their works,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, September 22, Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Wisdom 2:12, 17-20/James 3:16—4:3/Mark 9:30-3

For those who have recently been called to serve a loved one as his or her caregiver,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, September 29, Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Numbers 11:25-29/James 5:1-6/Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

That God will richly blessing all those who give “a cup of water” — and so much more — to a loved one who needs care,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, October 6, Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Gn 2:18-24/Heb 2:9-11/Mk 10:2-16 or 10:2-12

For all family caregivers, that on Respect Life Sunday and throughout the year, they will know in their hearts that caregiving is pro-life,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, October 13, Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Wis 7:7-11/Heb 4:12-13/Mk 10:17-30 or 10:17-27

For adult children who make many sacrifices — sometimes including giving up their careers, homes and friends — to take care of their aging parents,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, October 20, Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Is 53:10-11/Heb 4:14-16/Mk 10:35-45 or 10:42-45

In thanksgiving for the family caregivers in our parish and their continuing example of service,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, October 27, Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jer 31:7-9/Heb 5:1-6/Mk 10:46-52

For parents taking care of a child with special needs: May God always “console them and guide them”; and may we, their fellow parishioners, always be ready to offer them our support,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, November 3, Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dt 6:2-6/Heb 7:23-28/Mk 12 thanksgiving for the family caregivers in our parish and their continuing example of service,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, November 10, Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 Kgs 17:10-16/Heb 9:24-28/Mk 12:38-44 or 12:41-44

For adult children helping an aging parent who is a widow or widower,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, November 17, Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dn 12:1-3/Heb 10:11-14, 18/Mk 13:24-32

For those taking care of a loved one who wants to end his or her life: May the loving care they provide help that person wait for the hour and the day that belongs to God alone,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, November 24, Our Lord Jesus Christ the King

Dn 7:13-14/Rv 1:5-8/Jn 18:33b-37

That as members in Christ's kingdom, we will continue to offer our prayers and other acts of support to our fellow parishioners who are caregivers,
we pray to the Lord.

Thursday, November 28, Thanksgiving Day

Rv 5:1-10/Lk 19:41-44 (500) or, for Thanksgiving Day, any readings from the Lectionary for Mass (vol. IV), the Mass "In Thanksgiving to God," nos. 943-947

In thanksgiving for the caregivers in our families, in our parish and in our Church throughout the world,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, November 28, First Sunday of Advent

Jer 33:14-16/1 Thes 3:12—4:2/Lk 21:25-28, 34-36

May the Lord help caregivers increase and abound in love for their care-receivers, especially when those caregivers feel tired, angry or frightened,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, December 5, Second Sunday of Advent

Bar 5:1-9/Phil 1:4-6, 8-11/Lk 3:1-6

For family caregivers in whom God has begun a good work; and for us, their fellow parishioners: that we will offer our support in helping them continue to complete it,
we pray to the Lord.

Wednesday, December 8, The Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Gn 3:9-15, 20/Eph 1:3-6, 11-12/Lk 1:26-38

For family caregivers, that they may know the Holy Spirit is with them always,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, December 12, Third Sunday of Advent

Zep 3:14-18a/Phil 4:4-7/Lk 3:10-18

That caregivers who are frightened or discouraged will know that God is in their midst and he will renew them in his love,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, December 19, Fourth Sunday of Advent

Mi 5:1-4a/Heb 10:5-10/Lk 1:39-45

For long-distance caregivers who will be traveling home to visit loved ones who are sick, elderly, disabled or frail,
we pray to the Lord.

Saturday, December 25, The Nativity of the Lord (Christmas)

Vigil: Is 62:1-5/Acts 13:16-17, 22-25/Mt 1:1-25 or 1:18-25 (13)

Midnight: Is 9:1-6/Ti 2:11-14/Lk 2:1-14 (14)

Dawn: Is 62:11-12/Ti 3:4-7/Lk 2:15-20 (15)

Day: Is 52:7-10/Heb 1:1-6/Jn 1:1-18 or 1:1-5, 9-14

For parents whose child has special needs,
we pray to the Lord.

Sunday, December 26, The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

Sir 3:2-6, 12-14 or 1 Sm 1:20-22, 24-28/Col 3:12-21 or 3:12-17 or 1 Jn 3:1-2, 21-24/Lk 2:41-52

For family caregivers who continue to show us what it means to love another person as God has commanded us to love,
we pray to the Lord.
